Photographic exhibition: Presents the social history of Lemnos during World War I, commemorating the special bond between the ANZAC soldiers, nurses and the Lemnian community in 1915.

Sculpture display: Features sculptures and work by artist Takis Kozokos who works by hand in marble using traditional techniques and tools. Most notably, he has worked on the restoration of the Parthenon in Athens.

2015 marks one hundred years since the Anzacs and the Australian Red Cross nurses participated in the battle of Gallipoli. They departed for battle from the Greek island of Lemnos, which served as an army and hospital base. Lemnos was also where they returned to recuperate. To commemorate the Anzacs and the role played by the island of Lemnos, the Sydney Hellenic Lyceum has brought two dance groups from Greece, together with a five-piece band. They will be joined by two hundred Greek-Australian dancers in traditional Greek costumes, performing dances from the Greek islands.



During World War I, on 25 April 1915, British and ANZAC forces began an attack on the Ottoman Empire's strategic Gallipoli peninsula. The naval attack was repelled and, after eight months' fighting with many casualties on both sides, the land campaign also failed and the invasion force was withdrawn to Egypt.

Twelve men of Greek heritage served on Gallipoli with the Australian armed forces, while at least forty served on the Western Front in France or Belgium. Marking the 100th Anniversary of the Gallipoli Campaign, the exhibition is dedicated to these young warriors. 








Darwin's Footprint: A Book by Dr Maria Zarimis


