About Conference Objectives

The pivotal role of the Greek Diaspora regarding the planning and implementation of the national liberation struggle has been highlighted within the framework of the celebrations for the Bicentennial of the Greek Revolution. Since then, the Greek Diaspora has decisively contributed through various actions, within Greece but also in many countries worldwide, to the battles for survival of the Greek state.

The role of the Diaspora for Greece remains equally important today, concerning Hellenism as a whole, inside and outside the country. This applies particularly to the hoped-for prospect of repatriation of more than 500.000 Greek citizens that have left their homeland during the past decade, depriving Greece of a crucial source of human potential and talent.

On that basis, this initial conference mainly aims at focusing and emphasizing the goal “*Connecting to Greece: How Greek Diaspora views Greece and how Greece perceives the Diaspora*”. The program of presentations is structured along the lines of the three sections of the Academy: Physical Sciences, Ethical and Political Sciences, as well as Letters and the Fine Arts.
