Celebrating Greece's National Day in London



Each year on March 25, Greeks around the world celebrate Greece's National Day. The date marks the start of the Greek Revolution in 1821, which led to the creation of the Modern Greek State.

The Embassy of Greece in the UK marked the occasion this year with a reception – the first after more than 10 years – at the Hellenic Residence in London on March 26th. In the attendance of Greece's Minister of National Defence, Nikos Dendias, the event brought together friends of Greece and distinguished guests including British officials, members of the Greek Diaspora in the UK and the diplomatic community in London, to commemorate 203 years since the start of the Greek War of Independence in 1821 and to celebrate its everlasting message of freedom.

In his welcoming remarks, the Ambassador of Greece, Yannis Tsaousis, underscored the historical significance and universal resonance of the Greek War of Independence. He praised the vital contribution of the Greek Diaspora, both in the UK and across the world, to Greece's progress ever since, and highlighted Greece's achievements in recent years in a number of fields.





As we mark 200 years since Lord Byron's death in Mesolongi, Greece's National Day is "also an opportunity to celebrate the bright present and the even brighter future of the Greek-British bilateral relations, which are of strategic importance and strength", he stressed.

Emphasising too the significance of the Greece-UK relationship, ties and longstanding friendship, the Chair of the All-Party Parliamentary Group (APPG) for Greece, MP Alberto Costa, also delivered remarks for the Day.





2nd Annual Review of Greece-UK Strategic Bilateral Framework

Deputy Foreign Minister Alexandra Papadopoulou and the UK Minister for Europe at the FCDO, Leo Docherty, met in London on the 30th of January to carry out the second annual review of the Greece -UK Strategic Bilateral Framework (SBF).

The two Ministers discussed progress under the various SBF pillars, which helped strengthen further UK-Greece bilateral cooperation in support of our shared objectives and in addressing common concerns. Particular focus was placed on current issues of international affairs, including the situation in Ukraine and Gaza.

Deputy Minister Alexandra Papadopoulou underscored Greece's candidature for an elected seat on the United Nations Security Council for the term 2025-2026 and the upcoming 9th Our Ocean Greece Conference, to be held in Athens, on 15-17 April 2024. Discussions were also held on defence cooperation, energy security, investment and sustainable development, maritime affairs, as well as on education.



Greece introduces Online Postal Voting Platform



In a landmark move aimed at facilitating voters' rights, Greece has launched an online platform for postal voting registration. The online platform provides the option of postal voting for participating in European elections and national referendums. This initiative, following the passage of the relevant law through Parliament, marks the first time postal voting has been established in Greece. The platform allows all Greek citizens registered in the electoral rolls, regardless of their location, to exercise their right to vote via postal ballots. <u>As registration for the June 9 European Parliament elections must be completed by April 29, citizens are encouraged to utilize the online platform and exercise their voting rights effectively.</u>

To register, voters can access http:/epistoliki.ypes. gov.gr, using their taxis code, if they have one, otherwise they can utilize their passport details, police ID card and/ or municipality number.

International Greek Language Day

Greek Minister of National Defence visits London



To mark the International Greek Language Day on February 9, Greek Embassy organised an event with distinguished speakers. Defence Minister Nikos Dendias and British acclaimed author Victoria Hislop, among esteemed Greek & British guests and dear friends, to celebrate the Greek Language, its millennia-old history, its international impact, resonance and appeal to this day.

Following a video message by Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs Giorgos Kotsiras, Ambassador Yannis Tsaousis addressed the event speaking about the significance of the Greek language and its remarkable continuity through the centuries before highlighting i.a. the central place that the promotion of Greek language learning holds within the Ministry of Foreign Affairs' Strategic Plan for Greeks Abroad. Later on, in a thought-provoking conversation with Ambassador Y. Tsaousis, Victoria Hislop spoke about her journey into learning Greek & writing about Greece, while British Oxford student Ethan Chandler shared with us his personal account of how his love of Greece motivated him to learn the language.

How charitable organisations integrate Greek language learning into their work was the focus of 2 presentations about the Daughters of Penelope initiative to promote Greek education to Diaspora children & Kind at Heart Foundation's educational project in Tanzania. Representing the Greek & Cypriot Diaspora in the UK, school students from the Greek Primary School of London and the Hellenic School of High Barnet gave an unforgettable performance of Greek songs and a brilliant poetry recital.





On March 26-27, Defence Minister Nikos Dendias was on a visit to the UK for a series of high-level meetings. During his stay in London he held, among others, discussions with the UK's National Security Adviser (NSA), Sir Tim Barrow, and the Labour Party's Shadow Defence Secretary, John Healey, focusing on the Greece-UK defence relationship and cooperation, as well as on global and regional security matters, including the situation in Ukraine, the Eastern Mediterranean, the Middle East and the Red Sea.

The meetings provided also an opportunity for Minister Dendias to brief his interlocutors on Greece's role in the EU defensive Operation ASPIDES in the Red Sea and to underscore the prospects for cooperation between the Greek Armed Forces' defence innovation ecosystem and the British defence ecosystem.

This visit followed on from a previous one in February, 2024, where Minister Dendias had met with the then Minister for the Armed Forces of the United Kingdom, James Heappey, to explore ways to further enhance the Greece-UK defence cooperation, including on technology and research, and to exchange views on shared challenges. While in London, at the time, he had also discussed the potential cooperation of Greek and British War Museums with the General Director of the Imperial War Museums, Caro Howell.

Greek founders of innovative start-ups, showcased the potential of their MedTech start-ups and the fantastic opportunities for British investors. Participants shared their insights into the burgeoning Greek innovation ecosystem and exchanged valuable ideas on the way forward.





As Greece prepares to host the 9th Our Ocean Conference 2024 on April 15-17, Greek Embassy hosted an event on January 31 at the Hellenic Residence in London with the Greek PM's Special Envoy for the Ocean and Our Ocean Greece Coordinator, Dionysia-Theodora Avgerinopoulou.


A taste of Greece in International Food and Drink Event in London 2024

Greece at the London Book Fair in London

A delegation from the Hellenic Parliament visits London



For the first time Greece participated in London Book Fair at Olympia (12-14 March) within the framework of EU Recovery and Resilience Fund. The Greek pavilion, organized by the General Directorate of Modern Culture of the Ministry of Culture, hosted 40 Greek publishers and cultural institutes, and showcased 700 publications in Greek and other languages. The translation grant program Greeklit was also presented as part of Greece's aim to promote the dynamic Greek publishing sector abroad and to disseminate Greek Letters internationally.

The Secretary General of Contemporary Culture, Ms Eleni Doundoulaki together with the Greek Ambassador Yannis Tsaousis were shown around the vibrant and busy Greek pavilion, after attending the discussion on the translation of Greek literature 'Voices of Greece. New Challenges and Perspectives' at International Markets Theatre at Olympia London. While in London, Ms Eleni Doundoulaki together with officials from the Ministry of Culture visited the Hellenic Residence, where Ambassador Yannis Tsaousis showed them around the Embassy's permanent exhibition "GeorgeSeferis : the man, the poet, the diplomat"

On the occasion of London Book Fair, the Hellenic Centre hosted on the 13th of March, an event, organized by the Ministry of Cutlure, on 'Greek and British female Poets talk about Poetry and read their Poems', where female poets recited poems in Greek & English language, while they shared with the audience their concerns and dreams for the future of poetry.

Affiliation agreement between Athens Medical Group and Imperial College Healthcare NHS Trust



Ambassador Yannis Tsaousis and the Greek Consul General in Manchester, Alexandros Ioannidis, were on a visit to Liverpool on February 1, to meet with the city's Greek community, local government officials and business representatives. At the Liverpool Town Hall, Ambassador Tsaousis and Consul General Ioannidis were welcomed by Lord Mayor of Liverpool Cllr Mary Rasmussen for an excellent first meeting. They were joined by Cabinet Member for Growth and Economy, Cllr Nick Small, in productive talks exploring possibilities for cooperation on various sectors, including on business and investment, followed by an equally fruitful meeting with Liverpool Chamber of Commerce CIC members and representatives of UK companies being -or aspiring to be-active in Greece.



An affiliation agreement was signed in London on the 20th of March between the Athens Medical Group and the Imperial College Healthcare NHS Trust, through which the two leading institutions will exchange expertise, specialisation, medical know-how and knowledge, advancing their common cause of offering medical excellence and unparalleled services to patients worldwide. This is the first affiliation for Imperial College Healthcare in Europe. The agreement is yet another illustration of the strength of the long and rich Greek – British economic partnership.
